When Angels Were Needed ~ TALGV Was There



It was August 16th when the phone call came from a desperate young family with a very ill pooch who had just given birth to 10 pups. They had already spent \$400 on the mama dog who had mastitis, a mammary gland inflammation, and pyometra, a serious uterine infection, and just couldn't manage any more. TALGV stepped in immediately to try to save the mother, and the grateful family took on the responsibility of caring for the newborn pups – bottle feeding them every two hours around the clock while trying to work their full time jobs. TALGV was in close contact with the family who finally admitted, after a week, to being exhausted. They did not ask, but we decided to try to provide some help.

The call went out to TALGV volunteers and those who responded became our Puppycare Angels. They assembled at TALGV on Sunday, August 26th, where they learned and shared about how to be surrogate

moms and dads to Apple Jack, Captain Crunch, Chex, Coco Puff, Fruit Loop, Honey Nut, Kix, Sugar Puff, Trix, and Wheatie, the Cereal Puppies. That day the puppies were split among four homes where their every need was lovingly and diligently attended to. As they hand-fed, stimulated, and cuddled the pups, the Angels became even more appreciative of the job that the family had done in caring for ten. They rallied to help one another when other obligations called for backup, so the puppies had the opportunity to be with more littermates as they began to learn some of the very important doggy rules about getting along with others like - hey, don't bite my ear so hard!

The puppies prospered, and on Thursday, October 4th, they were brought back to TALGV for adoption. By the end of the weekend, only two pups remained. Today, all of these vigorous, well-socialized pups are living in families where there is someone home during the day to continue their upbringing. Mama dog has recovered, and is back with her own family (spayed, of course), and we saw that angels come in many forms.

Construction Ahead? Yes!! January

This was to have been the groundbreaking issue for our building expansion project. We had done all that we could to be ready in October - the plans were approved, the permits had been obtained, and the contractor was ready to start. What we did not know was how many more weeks it would take to get the paperwork completed after our loan application had been so readily approved. This has been especially dismaying because we have been able to set aside \$850,000 of the projected \$1,250,000 cost of the project. However, none of TALGV's funds can be spent before the loan closing without causing the loan to be cancelled.

One advantage of the delays has been the accumulating of more of our own funds. The term of the loan is 10 years, but our goal is to pay it off in less than 5 years without in any way detracting from the care of our shelter cats and dogs and those



we help in the community. We are rather shy about asking, but any additional help that you can provide to help us pay off the loan as soon as possible would sure be nice, making more money available for animals and less being spent on interest. Please remember that you can also help by shopping or donating goods at our Attic Thrift Shop, and supporting our fundraising activities. As was pointed out in the article above, angels do exist and come in many forms.

What's in a name?




Did you ever wonder how the animals at The Animal League get their names? Some animals come to us with a name and of course we keep it, even if it means we have **Benji 1** and **Benji 2** in the kennels. When an original name must be

chosen there are several possibilities. First, the location where they were found gives us names like Tubac or Mariposa. Of course some pets just look like their name; it's obviously part of their aura. For instance, the black and white cat is Domino or the white dog is Casper and the black cat is Licorice. Some pets exhibit a personality trait that influences the naming: Princess, Roxy, Buddha or Chico. Other animals provoke images of famous people or other critters: Scooby, Lauren or Remington. When naming litters that arrive at our doorstep it is helpful to keep the names in a "theme", such as the Cereal Puppies: Trix, Captain Crunch, & Chex ~ the Weather Puppies: Monsoon, Rain, Snow & Rainbow ~ the Salad Kittens: Waldorf and Caesar ~ or the Fruit Kitties: Kiwi, Plum & Blackberry. This

makes it easier to recognize littermates, and if by chance they return to us, it gives a frame of reference to their origin. Then there are names that just appear out of nowhere: **Peekytoe**, **Koda**, or **Squiggy**.



Naming our animals at TALGV is a group effort. It all depends on who is present at the time of intake and where those minds go at that moment to think up a name.





should consider when searching for that perfect moniker. Keep it short - preferably one or two syllables so that it's easy for your pet to learn. Match it to the pet's personality or appearance. Use your imagination: a favorite book character, an interesting place, a favorite actor or food. And don't forget your sense of humor, you can always take the initiative and be totally original when you name a pet: Pita Pan, Captain Insane-O, Schmorkle or Rootie Patatootie!



As in many other shelters, we give our adoptable pets creative names or names that provide a peek into the pet's personality. But if you can't envision yourself hollering for **Polly Picklepuss**, and you prefer to give your pet a new name, animal behaviorists

tell us it is okay to change a pet's name. Here's how: add their new name to their old name for a few weeks, then gradually phase out the old one. Your new pet will happily respond to whatever name you choose.






