

LOST YOUR PET? HERE'S HELP!

According to American Humane Association, 10 million cats and dogs are lost or stolen every year. For cats, the return rate is approximately 63% and for dogs 84%. If you discover your pet is missing, take these steps immediately:

- At your home, put out food and water, a litter box or dog bed, treats, and your pet's favorite toys. Choose a safe spot within your property that the cat or dog can easily access. If possible, keep your gate/door/garage door open.
- Search the area of the neighborhood where the pet was last seen. To determine a range, consider the pet's personality and physical condition. Include arroyos and walking paths near your home.
- When searching, always bring a slip leash, a carrier, and pet treats. Call your pet's name and pause often to listen.



Drive slowly around your neighborhood. Put a



Place a scent article of clothing or socks where the pet was last seen. The pet may wait for the owner there, so check the area regularly. For cats, touch nearby trees and put scent articles near them. The best times to search for cats are dusk and dawn.



Give them your name, number, and description of the pet. Call daily to check status.

DON'T CHASE THE PET!

CALL TALGV!

- Check a dog's favorite places. Drip a scent-track of broth to your home. Sprinkle flour on the ground to record any pawprints that occur.
- Telephone your neighbors or knock on their doors to tell them that you are searching for your lost pet. Show them a picture. If you lost a cat, ask them to check their garages. Also ask them to share any info with other people in the neighborhood.
- Keep your phone available to receive incoming calls or Facebook messages about the lost pet.
- Call The Animal League to see if your lost pet has been found and brought to our site. If not, tell them that you need "Missing Pet" posters and they will put you in contact with our "Missing Pet" volunteer. See section below for more info.







- When you see your lost pet, sit down on the ground and assume a non-threatening manner. Try to get the pet to approach you. Use treats and have the slip leash ready. Pets on the run are in a mode of heightened awareness of danger and SHOULD NOT BE CHASED.
- Borrow a trap from The Animal League or Paws Patrol. To place the trap in the right location, track the pet's movements and determine if there is a pattern. Check the trap often.
- Post a free "Lost Pet" notice in the GV News/ Sahuarita Sun (520-549-2917).
- File a police report if you think that the pet was stolen.

When you request posters from TALGV, we will ask for the pet's picture, name, breed, and the location from which the pet was originally lost. We will also need your name and contact information—phone, email, or any other method of contacting you. Once we complete them, you can pick up 10 posters at the TALGV office. The posters are free and you can hang them in local areas of your choice. We also display

posters at TALGV's facility and upload a copy to our Facebook page (www.facebook.com/TALGV) to provide a wide online notification about your lost pet.


